Urgent – Weather Message High Wind Advisory

Antigua and Barbuda Meteorological Services 11:00 am Friday 14 February 2025

... High wind advisory in effect for Antigua and Barbuda...

Locations to be affected: Especially exposed coastal waters and elevated and open terrains, on the windward side of the islands.

Timing: Until tonight.

Synopsis: Strong gusty winds are occurring due to a tight pressure gradient. Gusts of 84 km/h or 52 mph have been estimated from observed two-minute sustained winds of 64 km/h or 40 mph, in the last 24 hours. The risk to life and property is low but be aware of potential for gale/storm-force wind gusts and keep across the latest forecasts. These winds could make some outdoor activities uncomfortable, if not outright dangerous. Gale-force wind gusts can affect your balance; it's advisable to avoid exposed elevated areas or getting too close to precarious positions like cliff edges, given the forecast conditions. High winds could create dangerous falling or blowing objects. A high wind advisory means strong sustained winds in the range of 40 to 48 km/h (25 to 31 mph, 22 to 27 knots) with higher gusts imminent or occurring.

Wind: East at 28 to 44 km/h (15 to 24 knots; 17 to 28 mph) with strong gale/storm-force gusts estimated at 84 km/h (45 knots; 52 mph).

Potential impacts: Includes injuries; very hazardous seas; soil erosion; localized disruptions of some businesses; disruptions to outdoor and sporting activities; disruptions of transportation (air and especially sea); vehicular accidents and financial losses.

Caution: Residents should secure loose, light outdoor items, which can be blown away, and caution should be taken when driving. Further, avoid exposed elevated places.
